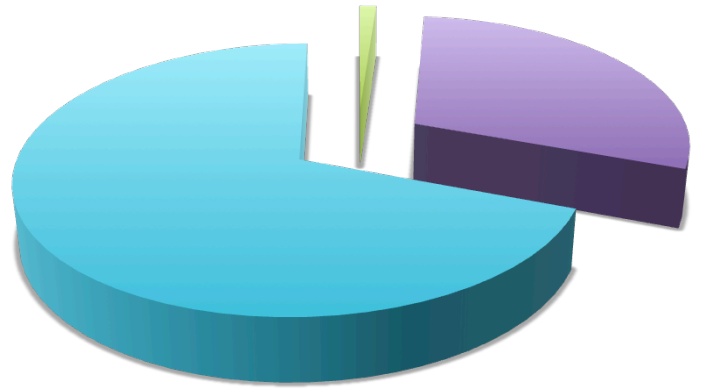

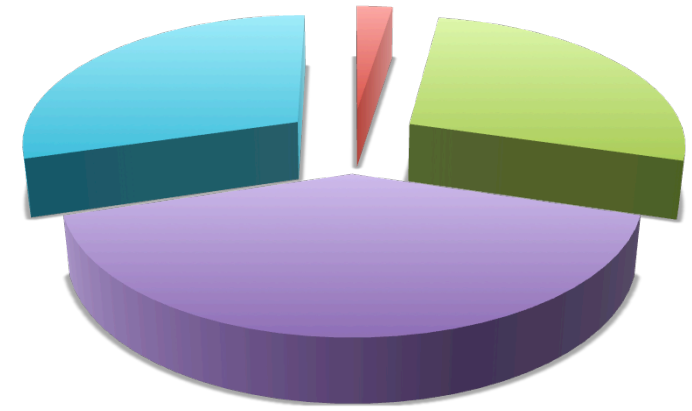

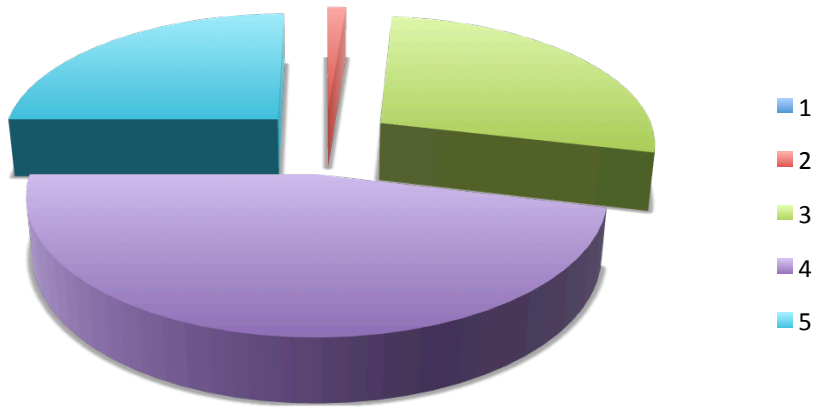

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Session on angina and role of diagnostic tests in view of recent changes in guidelines (specifically ETT). Helpful to discuss management strategy for anti-anginal drugs.

Could Dr Adamson take us through ECGs beyond AF and ST elevation

Handouts of the presentation, maybe to be able to keep some of the information handy.  
> but very good.

Lunch would be better planned a little earlier in the day – concentration was unfortunately waning ++ pre-lunch. Would have been useful to have all NICE guidelines on the table – often slides not visible!

Small group work in the morning session for a mental break.

Heart failure lecture probably not wholly relevant to GP trainees, a bit too much to take in after lunch.

Dr Shackley's presentation would be more useful if I was in General Practice.

Dr Shakley tried to cover too many topics in too little time and didn't successfully cover any.

Less GPSIs , more consultants

If we could have been told a little bit about “rapid access chest pain clinic” (when to access etc)

Not enough of the tues am / pm handouts to view quite complex info

Group work cases were confusing

A bit more cardiology

More on angina management, who to start on aspirin for primary prevention,

Could we have hard copies / pre-emailed copies of ECGs – little difficult to see on a power point screen.

Too much QoF talk from Shackley – I understand it is important but at the present stage would have liked more on current guidelines / Nice ; not just the assumption that we know it all i.e . cardiovascular risk scales etc. A lot of “I Hope you know what I am talking about” + queries over what treatment to use.

Can we all have handouts of the case studies for reference or email post session please.

I felt Dr Shackley’s session was “wishy washy”. I don’t feel I learned much. If he had been told what the other topics were covering, maybe he could have focused on other topics and made them more useful?

Couldn't see the ecgs – could you send the presentation earlier? Then I could read it on my ipad!

Palpitations – GP perspective – a bit confusing

Palpitations lecture (Shackley) – covered several topics superficially + too basic

Heart failure lecture useful but unable to see slides from back of the room

The GP perspective was not useful to many ST1s. Also got some medications wrong. Email out handouts for us before so they are clearer. Dr Banerjee's lecture good but slides too small to see from the back of the room.

Some conflicting information regarding AF post MI ?refer ?BNP

Not enough cases printed out per table.

More structured talk from Dr Shackley

Group work could have been better > but very pleased that didn't have to do a presentation or poster – thanks for that !
